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**Directions**

From **Carson Road** in **Camino**  
take  
**Snows Road** for **approximately 2 miles**  
to the  
**Rancho del Sol entrance** on the left  
come in on the main  
**Puerta del Sol Road**  
exactly **1 mile** to  
**4501 Puerta del Sol Road** on your left  
**Enter under the covered bridge and make an immediate right turn on the gravel drive  
around the pond**  
Follow the signs and park on the flat grassy area to the East of the pond.

From **Pleasant Valley Road**  
turn on to  
**Newtown Road**  
right on to  
**Snows Road**  
turn **Right** at the **Rancho del Sol** entrance  
Stay on the main road **Puerta del Sol Road exactly 1 mile**  
to  
**4501 Puerta del Sol Road**  
**Enter under the covered bridge, and make an immediate right on the gravel road around**  
**the pond**  
Park on the flat grassy area to the East of the pond.
