Get ready to don your best Easter Bonnet for our April meeting which will be held at the Greenstone Barn in El Dorado on April 1st with a presentation by The El Dorado Beekeepers. As pollinators, bees play a part in every aspect of the ecosystem. The El Dorado Beekeepers organization was founded in 2010 to support beekeepers and beekeeping in El Dorado County. May will bring flowers - our May meeting will be held at the Bluebird Haven Iris Farm in Somerset on May 6th. We will round out our Spring lineup with our June 3rd meeting at Bluestone Meadow Farms in Placerville. Bluestone is a lavender farm stated in 2009 on a parcel of the original Madden Ranch, part of the area's rich history. The farm was named after the blue rocks found on the property which are believed to be from the Deep Blue Lead goldmine, one of the richest gold strikes in Placerville. We will have a presentation by the owner and tour of the gardens. They have a gift shop onsite where can purchase their many products produced from their lavender plants.
