   (July 29th) to discuss what she saw as the need
- She indicated that 40% of the people in Grizzly Flats did not have any insurance and many more were under insured
- Very few of the properties have water or electricity yet
- Most of the properties have been cleared but very little construction has started - they are still waiting for the various payments, permits, etc.
- Kathy would like to have a community garden created. She has not identified a
  piece of public property suitable for the garden. She will continue working on
  getting the necessary approvals
- Once a month The West Slope Foundation comes to the area for a general giveaway of all manner of items, when the time is right, we could participate in one of those events
- Seed gathering Debbie will do some research to determine which local businesses will allow us to put baskets for the community to donate seeds. If Kathy can identify public spaces where we could spread wildflower seeds and/or bulbs, we can gather a work group together and actually plant them to help bring beauty back to the area.
- Conclusion: Next spring is likely the better timeframe more information is required before we can determine how to help
- Our October meeting will have another raffle we will need donations. Beekeeping will be our presentation. Maybe bee related raffle items?
- November meeting at the Community Church with the traditional pot luck
